## **Campus News – Spring 2017**

### ***New England College of Optometry:***

It is with great sadness that NECO notes the passing of alumni Dr. Richard Wallingford Jr., OD '75. Dr. Wallingford was an industry partner of AOCLE through his position as Senior Director of Professional Affairs at Johnson & Johnson Vision Care. He is a past President of the AOA and served on the NECO Board of Trustees. In 2015, NECO presented Dr. Wallingford with an honorary degree.

### ***Nova Southeastern University College of Optometry:***

**Dr. Chandra Mickles** was named Professor of the Year by the Class of 2018. This is her second consecutive year receiving this award at NSUCO.

### ***The Ohio State University College of Optometry:***

**Dr. Jeffrey J. Walline**, Ohio State University College of Optometry's Associate Dean for Research, has been appointed to serve a three-year term as a member of the university's Graduate Council.

The BLINK Study, a NEI funded randomized clinical trial to determine whether soft bifocal contact lenses slow the progression of myopia in children, accomplished its recruitment goal of 294 subjects in total at Ohio State and UHCO.

### ***University of Houston, College of Optometry:***

IACLE recently named **Jan Bergmanson, OD, PhD, DSc** as the 2017 Contact Lens Educator of the Year Award. This award recognizes and honors achievements in contact lens education worldwide. Bergmanson is not only a clinician, he is also an anatomist and pathologist. A founding director of the Texas Eye Research and Technology Center (TERTC) and diplomate in the Cornea, Contact Lenses and Refractive Technologies section of the American Academy of Optometry, Bergmanson is one of the preeminent doctors in the nation for corneal conditions.

At the 2017 Global Specialty Lens Symposium, **Dr. Anna-Kaye Logan** and **Dr. Judy Perrigin** received 2nd place for their research poster titled, "Microbial Growth after Cleaning Scleral DMV Device."

UHCO won the inaugural Custom Stable Cup at the AAO meeting in Anaheim. The CS Cup was an event held on the trade show room floor and co-sponsored by Optovue and Contamac in conjunction with Valley Contax. It was promoted exclusively by the AOSA. Points were earned as students trialed Valley's Custom Stable scleral lens and then utilized Optovue OCT and dynamic scleral lens software to analyze the lens on eye.

It is with great sorrow that we share Ketchum University's loss of a treasured family member. After years of battling breast cancer, **Dr. Harue Marsden** passed away in the comfort of her own home on Thursday, February 2, 2017.

"On behalf of the university, I was deeply saddened to hear of the passing of our colleague and dear friend, Dr. Harue Marsden. Harue's long battle with cancer was just part of the heroic efforts she made on behalf of our entire institution over many years," said President Kevin Alexander, OD, PhD. "Dr. Marsden had a strong work ethic and was incredibly resilient until the very end, even attending the university's annual Circle of Vision luncheon and continuing to see patients at Ketchum Health until the end of January. She will be greatly missed and forever remembered as an alumna and revered member of the faculty at the Southern California College of Optometry."

Dr. Marsden was a distinctive leader at the Southern California College of Optometry with expertise in cornea and contact lens

service. She joined the college in 1989 after completing a residency in family practice and master's degree at the University of Houston College of Optometry. Dr. Marsden was a professor and associate dean for clinical education at SCCO. She was a fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and diplomate in the Cornea and Contact Lens Section. She was also the owner of two private practices.

Dr. Marsden had primary clinical responsibilities in the cornea and contact lens service where she also served as chief for many years. She provided international lectures, publications and research in the areas of orthokeratology, contact lens management of the post-surgical cornea and laboratory testing.

As a beloved member of AOCLE, Harue contributed greatly to both the educational and social aspects of the annual workshops. Her distinctive laugh and quick wit were unforgettable. She will be sorely missed.

## IACLE

"Translating knowledge into increasing contact lens penetration" will be the theme for the 2017 IACLE Congress on Contact Lens Education, taking place in Hyderabad, India in September.
